Three Rivers School Board meets Wednesday

The Three Rivers School Board on Wednesday will hear a presentation from Superintendent Dave Valenzuela on the district's instructional materials policy.

The presentation comes amid a proposed rewrite of the Grants Pass School District's library and instructional materials policies to block or remove books some board members think could be defined as pornographic or obscene. Wednesday's presentation will also include a review of the Three Rivers district's public complaints policy.

Both reviews will be accomplished during a work session that starts at 5 p.m., followed by the board's regular monthly meeting at 6 p.m.

The work session will take place in the Illinois Room at Three Rivers headquarters in Murphy, with the regular board meeting to follow in the boardroom.

The meeting will also be livestreamed on the school district's YouTube channel, which can be accessed at 3riverssd.org.

RCC board will discuss voters' rejection of bond

Voter rejection of a \$60.3 million construction bond tops the agenda of the Rogue Community College Board of Education on Tuesday. The board is expected to discuss any takeaways that can be gleaned from rejection of the bond, which would have allowed for the expansion of workforce training like welding, automotive and emergency medical services.

Also on the agenda are the usual reports from staff and instructors, the RCC Foundation and President Randy Weber.

The meeting starts at 5 p.m. in Room 123A of Building A at the college's Table Rock Campus in White City.

Prior to the main meeting, the board will convene at 4 p.m. for a presentation on the topic "Accreditation Ad Hoc Report."
