MEDFORD, Ore.- Rogue Community College is seeking voter approval of a \$60 million bond tonight.

It aims to fund various projects across RCC campuses in both Jackson and Josephine Counties.

RCC says it would support the expansion and improvement of manufacturing, welding, and nursing programs, introduce an automotive program and create an EMT and diesel technology program.

It also says it will enhance safety, accessibility, and infrastructure at each of the school's three campuses.

To pass, the bond measure requires a 50% plus-one majority from the
