# Rogue Community College provides free dental x-rays

WHITE CITY, Ore. – Rogue Community College is giving the community a reason to smile with free dental x-rays.



This semester, RCC’s dental assistant and dental hygiene students are getting experience with taking full-mouth sets of x-rays. The x-rays would otherwise cost \$250 or more.

To be eligible, patients have to have at least 24 visible teeth, be at least 18-years-old and not have had a full mouth x-ray within the last three years.

Carmen Mons, director of RCC’s dental programs says this program gives her students a higher quality experience.

“They benefit from the fact that they’re working with a live patient, so that when they go out into offices, they’ve already had that experience... To have an actual 11 weeks when we have patients coming in almost that entire term – I think that we’re able to serve more community members,” said Mons.
